''To Every Man is Given a Gift'' **Game**

"For all have not every gift given unto them; for there are many gifts, and to every man is given a gift by the Spirit of God. To some is given one, and to some is given another, that all may be profited thereby" (D&C 46:11–12).

Supplies:

Wrapping paper Scissors/Tape Cake Mix Gift Cards Printout Oven Mitts

Preparation:

Printout gift cards on heavy paper and cut them out. Set them aside while you wrap up the cake mix, after the mix is wrapped add 1 gift card and then wrap up the mix again. Do this until all the gift cards have been hidden in between the wrappings. Add a bow and some ribbon. (optional)

Instructions:

Have the family members gather in a line. Pass the wrapped cake mix to the first person in the line. Have him try to open it with the oven mitts on his hands. Let each person spend a second or two trying to get it open before passing it on to the next one in line. When the "Gift" gets to the last person in line, let them open it up with their bare hands to receive the gift and read the card out loud. Then that person goes to the beginning of the line and tries to open up the next gift with oven mitts, everyone does the same until it reaches the last person, who then opens it without the oven mitts to reveal their gift. Keep playing this way until the whole family has opened received a gift. (You can make more gift cards, from the book as needed.)

Explanation:

After everyone has received a gift. Read D&C 46:11-12

"For all have not every gift given unto them; for there are many gifts, and to every man is given a gift by the Spirit of God. To some is given one, and to some is given another, that all may be profited thereby" (D&C 46:11–12).

Explain that not everyone gets all the gifts but everyone profits when we share our gifts with others. If time permits, get a discussion going by asking some questions like:

What did it feel like not to be able to open up the gift?

Did you get the gift you wanted if not what can you do to obtain that gift?

What does it mean to "Seek the best gifts?"

How can you find your real gifts?

How can you develop your gifts?

How can you use your gifts to help others?

How can you use your gifts in church?

How can you use your gifts in your family.

"For there are many gifts..." Can you think of more spiritual gifts?


The Gift of Healing (D&C 46:19 -20)




The Gift of Faith (Moroni 10:11)
